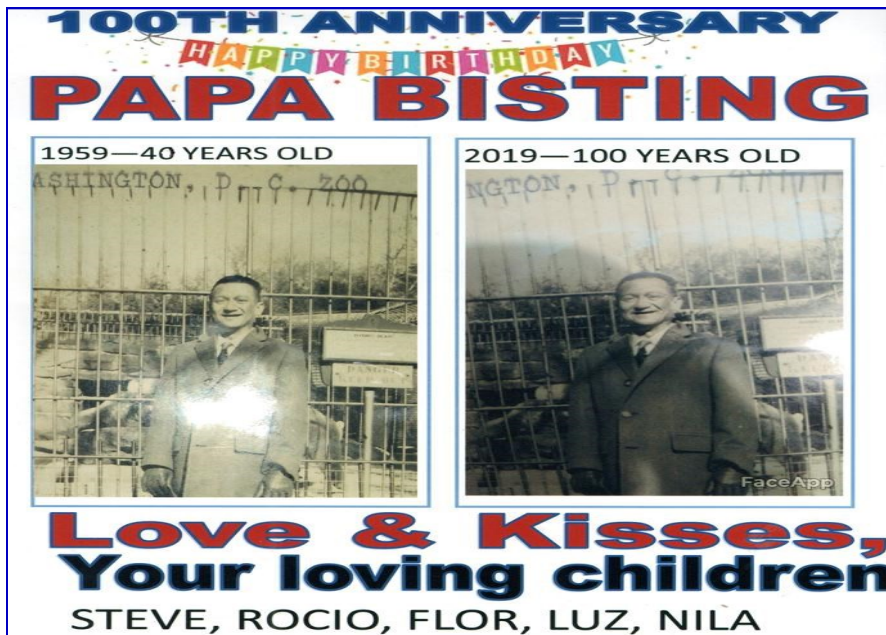

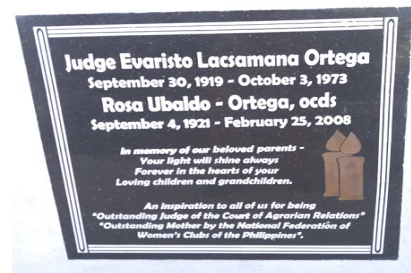
Nila's message recalls the Ortega Twins' birth.

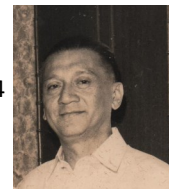
Dear Mrs. Ortega,

I have been intending to write you this letter of commendation for a long time since my esteemed colleague, your late husband, Judge Evaristo Ortega died last October. However, the pressure and volume of work has prevented me from doing so. It is only now that I find the opportunity to express to you my personal and official sentiments regarding your late beloved husband. Firstly, of course, with his passing I feel a deep personal loss because he was, at all moments I was with him, the irrepressible good-natured gentleman, a young advisor and a sober legal consultant. Secondly, he was one of the best District Judges that we, in the CAR, have been privileged to have. Since his appointment as District Judge of our Ozamis Branch in 1968 up to his demise last year, he has consistently been one of the ten (10) Judges of the Court with the most number of cases disposed. His records speak for him; in the fiscal year 1967-68, he was ninth (9th) among the ten (10) top District Judges of the CAR; in 1968-69, he was third (3rd); in 1969-70, eight (8th); in 1970-71, third (3rd); in 1971-72, fourth (4th); and in 1972-73, eight (8th). No doubt dedication to duty, hard work, unqualified competence and personal sacrifice contributed to his achievements. For all these, may I, although belatedly and posthumously, commend our late District Judge, the Honorable Evaristo Ortega, for a job indeed well-done.

No less deserving of this commendation are you, your children and the others whom he left behind who inspired him into dedicating himself to the service of his people and country.

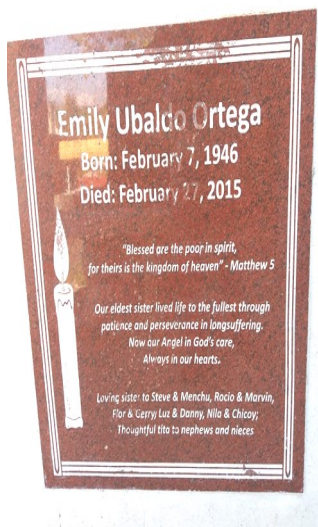

It was formerly a Municipal High School, FLOS, which was named after the illustrious daughter of Bangar Donia Francisca Lacsamana, who became the wife of the first Civil Governor of La Union, the late Don Joaquin J. Ortega.

It was nationalized on April 14, 1983 under Batas Pambansa Bilang 458 sponsored by the late Hon. Joaquin "Titing" Ortega and Hon. Jose D. Aspiras both congressman of L.U. It was signed into law by the late President Ferdinand E. Marcos on June 10, 1983 thus making FLOS in DFLOMNHs.

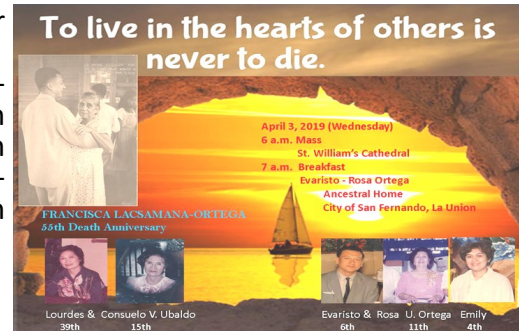

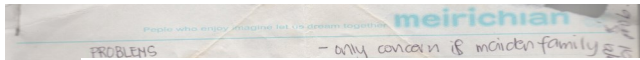

Twins married to bankers

Not all the memories that come to us are happy ones. I was brought back in touch with a painful loss of the Rural Bank of Sto. Domingo, Ilocos Sur.

In April 26, 1980 Pacifico Argel of Vigan, Ilocos Sur and I, Ma. Nila Ortega were wed at Ermita Church in Manila.

When God created marriage, he gave a foundational rule for relationships between a husband wife. 'Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother shall cleave to his wife, and the two shall be one flesh' (Genesis 2:24). Being the obedient child of God I left home to live with my husband at Vigan, the birthplace of my husband.

My late father-in-law, Judge Manuel A. Argel invested part of his retirement pay in the establishment of the rural bank. He was the principal stockholder. The following month, May 10, 1980, was the blessing of the bank's premises by Fr. Tashner and official ribbon-cutting ceremony was conducted. Provincial Government officials led by Governor Luis "Chavit" Singson, Central Bank of the Philippines officials and Rural Bankers of nearby municipalities of Ilocos Sur and my family at San Fernando, La Union were present. Twin sister Luz is married to Daniel

Bolong, manager of Sta. Lucia Rural Bank. My husband who was then a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Bachelor of Laws degrees, was working with the National Police Commission as Inspector. He took the offer of his father for the managerial position.

In 1997 the bank began to feel some problems. Due to economic crisis, borrowers of the Rural Bank of Sto. Domingo, Inc., were hard up paying their debts. My husband opened a credit line at Philippine National Bank (PNB) which was meant to save the Rural Bank.

The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) did not approve of the banks' assets to be used as collateral. Moreover, the rest of the stockholders were not willing to infuse additional capital. My husband had therefore no recourse but to use our personal properties (house and lot at Vigan and a building at Sto. Domingo, Ilocos Sur) as collaterals.

Gov. Luiz "Chavit" Singson supports the establishment of the new bank.

Despite our great desire and efforts to maintain the bank, after sometime, it was evident that it was no longer in a position to continue its operation. I told my twin that I will write about Bangko Rural ng Santa Lucia, Corp. (BRSL) then called as the Rural Bank of Sta. Lucia (Ilocos Sur) Inc. (RBSL) but she said, “no, I will be the one.” But, I have a gut feeling, that she will eventually like it.

Rural banks are the intermediary between the so-called informal credit market such as the 5-6 to the big commercial banks in the formal credit market. As such, they play a major role in providing accessible, safe and sustainable means of livelihood to the high-rich clientele—small farmers, fisher folks and marginalized groups in the rural areas.

In 1974, Rural Bank of Sta. Lucia (Ilocos Sur) Inc. was organized by Dr. Daniel S. Bolong, Sr., the President/Manager was Daniel T. Bolong Jr. The BRSL, occupied a prestigious status during its adolescent years, in the early '80s. This could be the reason why I wanted my future husband Pacifico Lahoz-Argel to be the manager of the Rural Bank of Sto. Domingo, his father, the late Judge Manuel Argel was planning to put up.

In 1982, it was number 8 in terms of resources; in 1983 the RBSL opened a new branch in Sta. Cruz; in 1986, the Central Bank recognized the BRSL as one of top Ten Rural Banks of the Philippines in Assets.

But as the “wheel of fortune” rotates—this business endeavor soon found itself at the lower portion of the wheel — to the surprise of my twin. In 1999, on its 25th year, the bank was a candidate for closure.

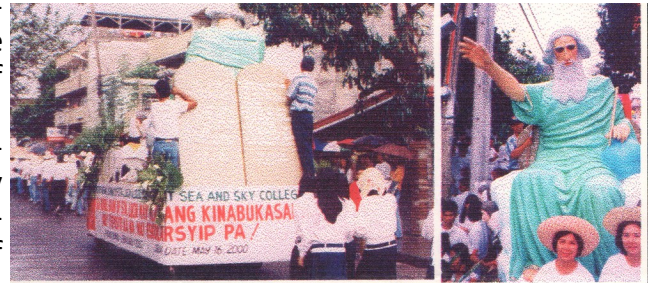
Inspired by the “luces” which “lucia” stands for, Dr. Ma. Luz O. Bolong, started as the bank’s liaison officer in November 22, 1999 and on January 24, 2000, her husband Daniel T. Bolong, Jr. tendered his resignation as President of the bank. He said in his letter he entrusted the operations and management to his wife as she has proven capability and commitment to manage the bank. Now, twin Luz as the new BRSL President valiantly took over the “silently ailing bank”. She was even elected President of the Association of the Rural Bankers in Ilocos Sur (ARBIS).

Determined to succeed and achieve re-birth, the BRSL celebrated its 26th anniversary with a Scholarship Millennium Promo to symbolize its sincere desire to regain the confidence of the bank’s clients and soar high like an eagle. On January 16, 2002, a program entitled “Persevering Discipleship” was held at the Sea and Sky Hotel and Restaurant. Excerpts of Luz’ Speech

I have not willed to gather you today like it were planned quite a time ago. This event as with all others since 1999, is a fascinating example that a Supreme Being chooses what we go through and that our only response should be a persevering discipleship.

With the birth of Sea and Sky, a tourism entity, the quest to grow professionally is there. I wanted so much to be a recipient of a tourism scholarship in Burges, Belgium.

But I want to believe now that God wanted me to let go of something I’ve held on for so long. He wanted my hands to be free, for a bigger gift He has prepared for me, something more challenging, doubly painful but all for His glory. Nobody wills denials, difficulties and disappointments. They are present for a purpose. And they will come again for a purpose.

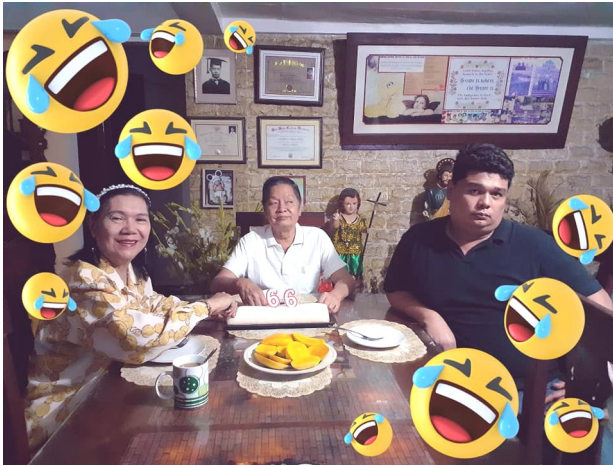

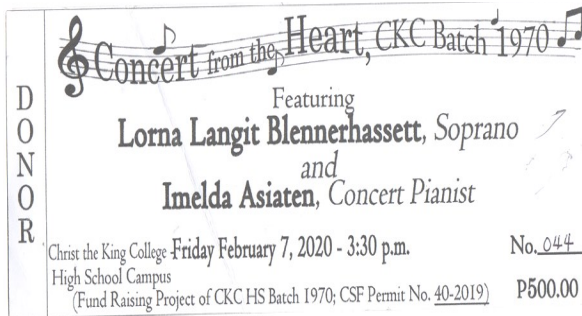

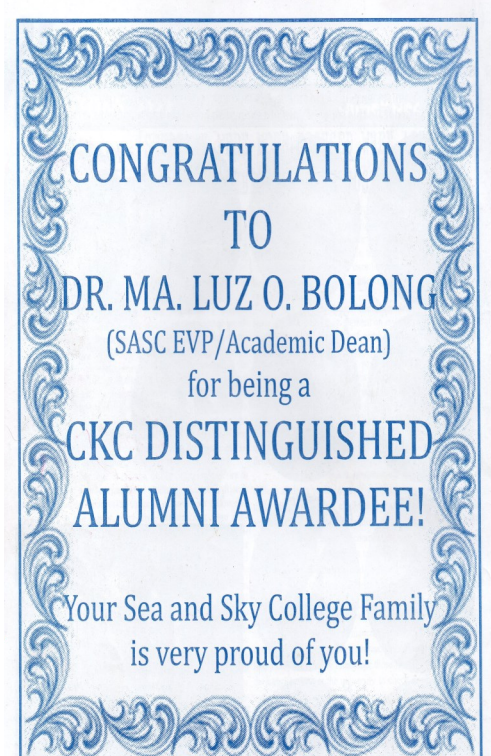
