9.1 Jubilee Year 2000 Pilgrimage

The Great Jubilee in 2000 was a major event in the Roman Catholic Church, held from Christmas Eve (December 24) 1999 to Epiphany (January 6) 2001. Like other previous Jubilee years, it was a celebration of the

mercy of God and forgiveness of sins.

Entrance to a Holy Door

A Holy Door is traditionally an entrance portal located within the Papal major basilicas in Rome. The doors are normally sealed by mortar and cement from the inside so that they cannot be opened. Holy Doors at Rome, Italy open only for the jubilee year. We twins entered the Holy Door at Saint Peter's Basilica on November 3, 2000.

Jesus' Birthplace

With the heightened on-going war in Jerusalem, Nila was hesitant to proceed with our Jubilee Pilgrimage, but Luz was determined. A few days later, Luz and the reluctant twin Nila completed a personal pilgrimage to the Holy Land. In the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem, a silver star with 14 undulating rays marks the location traditionally claimed to be that of Jesus' birth.

The Star of Bethlehem, or Christmas Star, appears in the nativity story of the Gospel of Matthew where "wise men from the East" (Magi) are inspired by the star to travel to Jerusalem. There, they meet King Herod of Judea, and ask him: Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him. The star leads them to Jesus' home in the town, where they worship him and give him gifts. The wise men are then given a divine warning not to return to Herod, so they return home by a different route. The only way one can touch the star over which Jesus was born and over which a light is burning is by humbling oneself and going down on one's knees.

The Feast of the Our Lady of Loreto and the Holy House – 10 December 2020

The Story of the Holy House of Loreto

One of the holiest and most popular pilgrimage destinations in Italy is Loreto. Written at the door of the Basilica della Santa Casa (Basilica of the Holy House) are these words: "The whole world has no place more sacred... For here was the Word made Flesh and here was born the Virgin Mother..." On entering the basilica, one finds beneath the central dome and just behind the high altar, a rectangular edifice of white marble, richly adorned with statues. The white marble, however, forms only a protective crust. The contrast between the exterior richness and the poverty of the interior is startling. Inside are the plain, rough walls of a cottage of great antiquity, thirty feet long by fifteen feet wide and about fifteen feet high. In the centre of the House of Our Lady, there is a replica of a wooden statue of the Madonna. The original one, made of cedar of Lebanon, arrived at Loreto together with the house but has since been destroyed.

According to tradition, this is the house where our Blessed Mother was conceived and born, grew up, and where the angel Gabriel asked her to become the Mother of God. This is also believed to be the house where the Holy Family lived; where Jesus grew up and worked until he left to reveal Himself to mankind. The Holy House of Loreto was carried by angels from Nazareth to the Italian hillside town of Loreto the night of Dec. 9-10 in 1294 after making a three-year stop in Croatia.

December 10 of 2019 is the first time that Our Lady of Loreto is celebrated in the General Roman Calendar. On October 7 the decree was pronounced by Pope Francis (although it was published on October 31) to be a reoccurring Optional Memorial for the Universal Church.

When we twins attended mass at the Carmel of the Holy Family Monastery Chapel at Pindangan, City of San Fernando, La Union, the priest was in white vestments. May this celebration help us all, to imitate the virtues of the perfect disciple of the Gospel, the Virgin Mother.

9.3 2004 Gregorian University Study Break

In our Mid-Course Break at the Gregorian University, we twins were supposed to go to Avila, Spain to see the first Carmelite monastery founded by St. Teresa of Avila. On May 28 we went to the train station to buy our tickets for Spain but we were told that we can only buy tickets up to Nice, France.

Arriving at Nice, France on June 1, we immediately went to buy our tickets for Spain. We had another dilemma. Contrary to the cost of ticket we knew, it turned out that our money is just enough for a round-trip ticket to Spain for one. When I told Luz that we go back to Rome for I was afraid that she would get lost, she said, "It's like you have pierced my heart with a dagger". I know I had to let her go; it was my twin's obsession to see the place.

After buying her ticket, we went out of the station and started walking when I saw the signage 'Caritas'. I told Luz they might be able to help me. We asked where we can find a Filipino community or a Filipino priest, and we were told us to go to the Basilica. There a foreigner priest looked at the directory and gave us the address of a Missionary House.

At a computer shop, Luz called the number and indeed a Filipino priest was on the other line. Here was the conversation that transpired: Luz: Fr. we are Ortega twins from the Philippines. We were supposed to go to Avila, Spain, but we don't have enough money. Fr., can my sister stay with you while I go to Spain? Fr. Yes, but where are you calling from? Luz asked the location from the computer shop owner who informed the priest. Luz: Fr. Really? Even the food? Fr. Yes, but you have to come here, for my place is far where you are. We took the bus and reached the place. Seeing a fortress nearby, Luz climbed while I waited down to look after our baggage. Then we reached the place of Fr. Clavero Guerrero, a Filipino priest based at the Mission Philippines, Nice, France.

Fr. mentioned that there is a church at the market place and he promised that he will bring me to the bus station to see the Laghet Sanctuary. In the morning, Fr. handed me a leaflet about the Sanctuary and he brought me to the bus station, explaining that he couldn't accompany me because he had many things to do. As I was reading, Fr. came back and reminded me, "Tell the bus driver where you are going." I was so overjoyed when I reached the place.

What could be the reason why God wanted us to go into different destinations? Not wanting me to feel so sorry for not proceeding to Spain, I was informed that at Nice there is a wax body of St. Teresa of Avila and there is also a Carmelite monastery at Carros Village.

Meanwhile, Luz was so happy having seen Avila, Spain. With the inspiring Saint Teresa's Bookmark _ 'Let nothing trouble you, Let nothing frighten you. All things are passing; Only God is changeless. Patience gains all things. Who has God wants nothing,' Luz is ever ready to serve God better and had a life-size statue of St. Teresa of Avila made out of tin.





9.6 Twins' five visit to Rome



In fulfilling the Lord's commission, we can say with much conviction that God is working with us. The spiritual journey in our life chronicles our experiences of faith, hope and charity (or love). Why do we say so?

<u>Jubilee Year 2000 pilgrimage</u> — His Eminence Jose T. Cardinal Sanchez whom we saw at Rome said that it was the worst time to go to Jerusalem because the warfare have significantly heightened. But with God's grace we were able to see Bethlehem in Jerusalem and kissed the silver star in a grotto under the Church of the Nativity.

<u>2002 Marian Pilgrimage</u> — Sister Maria Celine, the mother prioress welcomed us in the Coimbra monastery where Sr. Lucia lives. Although we were not able to see Sr. Lucia, we gave our

two gifts, statuettes of God the Father made of Pinatubo ash and fiberglass.

2004 Gregorian University Study—Luz greeted Apostolic Nuncio, His Excellency, Antonio Franco "Happy Birthday". He asked immediately, "what do you want?" "Study at Rome," Luz responded. The support granted by the nuncio led to the granting of our visa by the Italian Embassy.

2006 Mexico — After a visit to the Basilica of Guadalupe, our tour guide told us it is the end of our tour. At the bus station enroute to Guadalajara Luz saw a postcard at the souvenir shop the apparition site where the Our Lady appeared to St. Juan Diego. We took a taxi back to the Basilica and climbed the Tepeyac Hill for our pilgrimage would be incomplete if we missed it.

2009 Carmel Hue Vietnam Centennial Jubilee celebration — In our letter to the mother prioress prior departure, we expressed our desire to visit all the four Carmelite Nun Monasteries in Vietnam when we attend the Jubliee Celebration at Carmel Hue. After the occasion, Mother Prioress surprised us twins. She gave us a traveling companion. We visited the Basilica of Our Lady of La Vang, the sanctuary built to honor an apparition of Mary in 1798. Then we visited Carmel Saigon, Binh Trieu and Nga Trang.

2015 Fifth Anniversary of St. Teresa of Avila — Arriving at Avila, Spain, we went inside the San Jose Monastery Chapel. A lady from Barcelona who was at Avila for a visit and who knew we were looking for a place to stay for the night offered her help. "You are taking the taxi, aren't you", she asked? "Yes", we replied. "I am going to the La Encarnacion. I could bring you to CITeS (Centro Internacional de Avila), but we have to leave in 10 minutes". She helped us at the Front Desk. When the lady left she remarked, "I am your angel".

2017 Miracle of the Sun 100th Anniversary cum 84 Days Around the World — Twin Luz owns the Sea and Sky Hotel and Restaurant and Sky and Sky College with husband Daniel Bolong, Jr. However our pilgrimage was without family consent. It is not surprising that we encounter ob-

stacles/problems of every kind, but divine help comes at the right time.

The Sto. Domingo Rural Bank in Ilocos Sur was managed by my husband. In 1994, he opened a credit line at PNB which was meant to support the bank. My husband used our personal properties as collaterals. Despite our efforts to maintain the bank, it was put under receivership with the Philippine Deposit Insurance Company in 1997. On January 1998, we wrote Philippine National Bank telling that we are selling properties to settle our account. After sometime, we received a letter informing us that our house was for foreclosure in a specified time. The timely sale of our 1,500 square meters lot at Baroro, Bacnotan, La Union in 1999 saved our home.

When it was evident that twin Luz cannot expect financial support from her family, I have to solve the problem of "show money" to get travel visas. A proof that God approves of our travel/pilgrimage was the timely sale of our lot along the national highway at Sto. Domingo, Ilocos Sur. A bank certificate was issued for my "show money". One day Luz asked me, "Can we borrow from the Nueva Segovia Consortium of Cooperatives?" Twin Luz is an optimistic person. She thinks the best possible thing will happen. In trying to see the bright side of any dark situation, she generates amazing funds for her projects

PILGRIM PEOPLE

Several years back, Ma. Nila O. Argel enrolled in my modular courses in Religious Education in St. Paul College of Ilocos Sur along St. Paul avenue in Bayubay, San Vicente, Ilocos Sur, RP. As part of the requirement of finishing a modular course, each of my students writes a synthesis of the subject matter, in his/her own words, style, and creativity of presentation. I was always impressed how Nila presented her synthesis, done masterfully and creatively, with accompanying photos to stress points of the faith she studied in my course.



I had always encouraged Nila to write about the Catholic Faith and Tradition. Nila's initial reaction was an adamant "No". Although she is a mass communication graduate, she thought she was not competent enough as a thinker and a writer on matters of faith and morals. But once the successfully published her first short book, upon my persistent persuasion, she wrote other books, one after the other.

We keep on moving to the future where we search for the Triune God. In this pilgrimage, the faith, hope and love of people are tested, purified, disciplines, and perfected.

2017 is the centenary of the apparitions of Our Lady to the three children of Fatima. To go to Fatima for a pilgrimage is expensive. Only the moneyed people can make the pilgrimage to Fatima. They are blessed with travels as well, their means of inspiration to their calling. Their trips are not intended to collect destinations, but to create moments with the Lord at His appointed sites.

I know that this will not be the Twins' last travel together.
