INCE Nicholas V, of happy memory, in his Bull Cum nulla fidelium, dated October 7, 1452, and Sixtus IV, in Dum attenta, on November 28, 1476 invested the Prior General of the Carmelite Order, or his Vicar, with the perpetually valid faculty of erecting the Secular Order of the most Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel throughout the world, and since Clement VIII in his bull Cum dudum, dated March 23, 1594 and Romanum Pontificem, of August 20, 1603, extended this faculty to the Superior General of the Discalced Carmelite Order, I accept the petition to erect a Community of our Secular Order with the title of St Teresa, in the city of San Fernando, in San Fernando of La Union Diocese. Having received the consent of the Most Reverend Ordinary of the Diocese, I most willingly grant to Most Rev. Antonio R. Tobias, D.D., according to canon 312 of the Code of Canon Law, the faculty to erect, in my name, the above-mentioned group into a Community of the Secular Order of the Most Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel.

This certificate bears my signature and the seal of my Office, as a witness to this.


The Prior General pays tribute to Fr. Camilo Maccise, O.C.D.

During the 12 years as Superior General, Fr. Camilo together with Fr. John Malley, O.Carm, former Prior General who died a months ago, jointly built a strong bond between the two Orders of Carmel. They worked closely together.



God's Plan Second Lease of Life

AT MY TWIN'S BEDSIDE

On October 2, 2011, Sunday, a day before our presentation of a stage play "Born For You _ the Life of Teresa of Avila at Armed Forces of the Philippines Camp Aguinaldo Theater, Quezon City, I was rushed by my twin sister Ma. Luz at Salve Regina General Hospital at Mandaluyong, Quezon City because of severe stomach pains. Unmindful, I suffered a heart attack. The following morning at around 9 o'clock, I was feeling better and my twin sister asked the cardiologist that I be discharged from the hospital because of the stage play. I even recited a part of my dialogue,

"Such joy and pain....untan alegria y allavezn dolor!...overwhelming joy and pain as if I were drowning... Oh Juana....how can I explain this?

I was discharged from the hospital and we twins were on stage performing as if nothing had happened. After the stage play we went home to San Fernando, forgetting the doctor's advice to go back to the hospital after.

At midnight at the Twins Haven, my twin saw me sitting at our sala in front of the image of Our Lady of Namacpacan. She figured I was breathing, so she went to sleep. After a while I told her I felt severe pain. Our doctor sister, Dr. Rose Martinez instructed her to bring me to Lorma Hospital.

Fr. Sammy Banayat administered the blessing of the sick. Then, my twin rushed to the Carmelite Monastery to ask for prayers. Luz left the bouquet of flowers given to us twins during the stage play at Camp Aguinaldo Theater, Manila. Dr. Brenda Espinosa, the attending physician wrote a medical abstract.

MEDICAL ABSTRACT

I have attended to Ma. Nila Argel, 57 years old who was admitted to Lorma Medical Center last October 6, 2015 at 2:30 AM because of chest pain and difficulty of breathing. She had been having chest pains for the past two days while in Manila and was advised confinement which she refused. Instead she traveled back to San Fernando, La Union

Her BP at the ER was 90/60 which further dropped to 60/40 and hence was started on Dopamine, Dobutamine and Norepinephrine yet remained unresponsive, ECG showed Sinus Tachycardia, Normal axis, Poor R wave Progression, Diffuse Ischemia. She was initially treated as a case of Non ST elevation Myocardial Infraction, Killips IV. Her "toxic" condition of incessant chest pain, pulmonary congestion necessitating intubation and shock prompted me to review the ECG. I recognized the elevated ST segment in AVR, termed "sign of heaven" which speaks of very poor prognosis as it is associated with a left main coronary artery lesion or a 3-vessel coronary artery disease.

I then decided to transfer her to a higher center for immediate coronary revascularization, the nearest being Notre Dame, Baguio City. Unfortunately the receiving hospital notified me during transport that their respirator is not working. Dr. J. Calibuso, the invasive cardiologist opted to receive the patient in Baguio and transport and accompany her to Philippine Heart Center. Despite the hemodynamic instability, the patient made it to Manila to have her coronary artery bypass. That provided her with a new lease of life.

EXCERPT: Luz' reflection on St. Teresa Feast Day

The death last October 5 of Apple's founder, Steve Jobs, at age 56 is shocking. It is as if brilliant ideas that might have been coming henceforth has been nipped in the bud too early.

My twin Nila's new life at 57 after under going bypass surgery last October 7, the Feast of Our Lady of Holy Rosary, is a welcome relief. It is for this reason that I offer this piece of message to help Nila be bold and fearless in this critical time to her life, and in sharing our dreams. And what could be that dream? Like St. Teresa _ a great woman whose feast we honor today, Nila and all of us present here remember that we, too, are born for God and God alone.

Nila suffered a heart attack on October 2. it was foolish on our part to beg to the cardiologist to be discharged from the hospital the next day, October 3. It was the first day of the stage play. At times, our love for God is so extreme that we are branded as crazy or fools. When St. Teresa started her reformation, the nuns ridiculed her believing she was crazy. But the Dominican Father Pedro Ibanez gave her the greatest encouragement and affirmation to go ahead with the work of reformation.

Anyone who has stared death in the face like Steve Jobs adds, "there is no reason not to follow your heart." And so, with Nila, there was no other way but to follow her (sick) heart. Those who have heard about Nila's condition declare in unison a parallelism between Nila and St. Teresa's life occurrences. On October 6, Thelma Antonio, past president of OCDS Philippines said that Nila is blessed by God to experience Our Holy Mother Teresa's Transverberation. Nila's heart was pierced by the heart surgeon _ an angel in disguise. It is the Glory of God through her Transverberation which the play brought to life in a most amazing way.

Testimonies on Shooting held February 7, 2020

Fr. Provincial Delegate Benedick Piangco, OCD gave each of the Communities, copies of the photo of St. Teresa used during her centenary at Avila, Spain. I got two copies of the image and had it framed using 2442-8 gold moldings on December 16, 2019.

Last February 5, 2020, I (Jimmel Suguitan) and JR Quiton went to the OCDS House of Prayer to install the additional platform for the St. Teresa carosa and it was satisfactorily done. The picture frame that was placed at the rear side was really huge so we placed a counter weight at the front of the lower platform.

The artist saw that a thick slab of brick was left on the flooring of the carosa. When the artist took the slab of brick in his hands and put it down, the carosa tumbled backwards, the wheel of the bicycle went up the air and the two candle holders were thrown down on the ground with the base broken while the other one remained lying on the roof. The pentagon's roof opened throwing St. Teresa's statue to the ground. The face and body of St. Teresa statuette suffered no scratches or deformity. 

Sanctuary of St Teresa de los Andes

The most important Catholic Church in this area, located a few kilometers southeast of Los Andes, where the remains of St. Teresa of Los Andes are interred. The Sanctuary was built in 1988 for a 20th century saint, simple and modern with a beautifully painted allegory of light, with geometric details. In front of the painted geometric light is the image of Our Lady of Carmen. Underneath is the Tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament. The crypt holds the re-



nics and bathroom facilities.



One needn't live a long life to leave a deep imprint. Teresa of Los Andes is proof of that. As a young girl growing up in the early 1900's in Santiago, Chile, Juana Fernandez read an autobiography of a French-born saint — Therese, popularly known as the Little Flower. The experience deepened her desire to serve God and clarified the path she would follow. At age 19 Juana became a Carmelite nun, taking the name Teresa.

The convent offered the simple lifestyle Teresa desired and the joy of living in a community of women completely devoted to God. She focused her days on prayer and sacrifice. "I am God's," she wrote in her diary. "He created me and is my beginning and my end."

Toward the end of her short life, Teresa began an apostolate of letter-writing, sharing her thoughts on the spiritual life with many people. At age 20 she contracted typhus and quickly took her final vows. She died during Holy Week.


Luz read the book of Mother Therese in Allentown, Pennsylvania, an incorrupt American nun, for beatification. These Carmelite nuns have an exact replica of the icon of Mary, Mother of God. The artist sees Our Lady of Fatima as appearing this way in her last appearance as Our Lady of Mount Carmel

Mother Therese, known in the world as Anna Marie Lindenberg, was born of Joseph and Marianna Lindenberg, in Muenster, Westphalia, on May 20, 1877, the youngest of four children. Four days later, she was brought to the Cathedral of Muenster for baptism. A victim of cancer, Mrs. Linderberg had but one desire she wished fulfilled before her death, that her little Anna Marie might have her First Holy Communion advanced one year. Her request was granted for Anna Marie was permitted to receive Holy Communion on April 13, 1890.

On Easter Monday after the Holy Sacrifice, she had a slight heart attack. The nuns with filial affection, said: "You ought to rest, dear Mother." And she replied, almost prophetically: "Tomorrow, I will rest all day." On that memorable morning an acute attack of pain in her chest made it difficult for her even to move from her bed. One of the nuns tried to persuade not to

come to the choir for Mass. She replied simply: "Sister, I would not miss Holy Communion for anything in the world."

Words spoken by Mother Therese while very ill, and just shortly before her death clearly is a manifestation that she hungered after Holy Communion.

When the body of Cloistered U.S. Nun Mother Therese's was exhumed in August of 2001, who died 63 years ago—in 1939 it appears to be "intact" and holding a palm that remains green. St. Teresa of Avila wrote, "Unless we forget this body of ours we will never make any progress in perfection," and Mother Therese lived according to the maxim that "we must forget self."



Most of them were "retired teachers - many of them "missed" or widows"; but, they were "a very select group". They were called, "The Tertiaries of Carmel".





Baptized and Sent to the World

The two General Councils of the Friars O. Carm. and O.C.D., met in Gort Muire, the Provincial house of the Irish Province of the Carmelites (O. Carm.) located in Dublin, Ireland, to reflect on "Baptized and Sent: the Church of Christ on Mission in the World." Pope Francis reminds us that mission is rooted in Baptism and is the call to all the Baptized. Pope Francis' invites us to see mission from a deeper and broader perspective: "We ARE mission because we are God's love poured out, God's holiness created in his own image. How can we as Carmelites respond to the challenges







